Maria E. Harris, who focuses her practice on Social Security Disability and Long-Term Disability, is a member of the [American](#) and [Philadelphia Bar Associations](#) and a number of sections of each, including the Young Lawyers Division, Women in the Profession and Minorities in the Profession. She is bilingual in Spanish and English.
