- Attendees earn 7 Total CLE credits, 1 of which may be applied toward ethics
- Several social engagements planned during the conference offer attendees plenty of networking opportunities.

Both Wilson and Martin regularly and actively participate in educational activities that benefit practitioners all over the state and Wilson has, for over 10 years, been a member of the faculty that authors the section's textbook, "*Workers' Compensation Practice & Procedure*," a 900 page tome.
